8/ MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON

Monday 9th June 2008 and Monday 7th July 2008

9/ MATTERS ARISING THERE FROM

Monday 9th June 2008

- 90b SCFA Affiliations - dealt with (AC TION: Closed)
- 90e Cobra League Insurance – dealt with (AC TION: Closed)
- 90i Torellisport – it was decided in view of the RESPECT programme that at this time no further action will be taken (AC TION: Discharged)
- 99i SCFA (Appeal by Worthing Town Girls FC) - the appeal was dismissed by the Board of Appeal. Worthing Town Girls FC recognized that the League “had the right” to make the decision they did.

Monday 7th July 2008

- 4) Centre of Excellence – Alan Knight said that he had met with Kevin Tharme, Michelle Lawrence and Ken Benham regarding this issue and it was decided that the Development Squad be removed from the Brighton & Hove Albion Centre of Excellence Website. The Chairman clarified that girls in the Development Squad can play for their Clubs. It was also confirmed that Clubs are being notified via Loraine Perrin about players registered with the Centre.

There was some concern that according to the website they are running on a minimum number of girls, it was explained that in certain age groups the team is playing 9x9 until Christmas.

The question was asked that if the Centre teams train on a Thursday evening could the sign a girl on to play the following Sunday, which would seem unfair. The Chairman said once a girl had registered for the Centre she therefore could no longer play for her Club. This seemed rather unfair to the Club and the Secretary said he would write to Michelle asking for confirmation. (ACTION: Bob Rashbrook)

Although Brighton & Hove Albion Centre of Excellence detailed their registered players the League and Clubs are unaware of girls playing in other Centres. The Chairman said the responsibility is down to the Clubs to abide with the FA Ruling that ALL Registered Centre of Excellence Players cannot play Club League Football. The Secretary said that he will endeavour to contact other Centres and ask for details of any such Players.

10/ CORRESPONDENCE

- a. SCFA Ltd. - Centre of Excellence; Confirmation from Kevin Tharme that FA Council had agreed that girls registered with a Centre of Excellence must not play for their Clubs. The Secretary said he had contacted Peter Bentley (Chairman of SCFA and FA Councillor) but Peter was unaware of such ruling but did emphasise that it may have been dealt with at some time.
- b. SCFA Ltd. – League Statement (Club Suspensions) – Hastings Hawks Ladies suspended for non-payment of Affiliation Fees.
- c. SCFA Ltd. – League Statement (Club Suspensions) – Hastings Hawks Girls suspended from 13/08/2008 to 01/09/2008 for non-payment of Affiliation Fees. The League Secretary has contacted the SCFA informing them that this team is not a member of the League.

11/ REPORTS

a) Treasurer (Paul Baston)

- a. The current balance standing at the end of August is: £19,725.62

b) Secretary (Bob Rashbrook)

- a. Handbooks produced, a few things not happy with but that was down to Secretary not the printers.
- b. Had to chase up Agreement Forms, more important issues to deal with. Barring Hastings Hawks Ladies all other Clubs have returned forms except that Henfield Girls and Northfield Girls have different Officials as shown on their Application Forms. Have asked Clubs to update me but as yet nothing, also informed these two Clubs that they should let the SCFA know of any such changes.

c) Registration (Women) (Brian Shacklock)

- a. Registered: 222 – Transfers: 0
- b. Had a number of issues regarding Registration Forms, being incorrectly completed or signed by an unknown Club Official.

d) Registration (Girls) (Malcolm Harding)

- a. Absent (report submitted)
- b. Registered: 945 (27 dual registration) – Transfers: 0
- c. In his report Malcolm said the registration process this year was abysmal with Clubs not complying and leaving everything until the last minute, many Clubs unable to complete the basic tasks like signing the form !. in fact, for the record over 300 forms had to be returned due to errors.

The question was asked “do Clubs know the process when they join the League ?”, the Chairman explained that all the basic things like registrations, fixtures etc. are spelled out to them at their interviews but it is not necessarily the new Clubs that are the problem.

e) Fixture Secretary (Paul Preston)

- a. Just when it was thought the weather was going to get better the rain came back slightly earlier than anticipated and to have postponements on the first weekend is unprecedented in my eighteen years of football experience.
- b. The weather was the least of our worries as again teams failed to register enough players in time for their first fixture. Clubs were given enough opportunity to register and failed to do so.
- c. There has been numerous Clubs/Teams withdrawing from various divisions which has caused a lot of additional work.
- d. Paul said he has started to add the Secretaries of the Ladies Section to Full-time so they are automatically informed of match official changes. This can include fixture changes so if there are any Secretaries in the Girls Section that wish to receive these changes please let Paul know.
- e. Although there was a prospect of two good sized divisions in the Ladies Section it has become increasingly worrying that teams have started to withdraw. Paul asked that if there

were any more withdrawals could he have permission to amalgamate the two divisions. He went on to say that due to already starting the season a week later than other divisions it may be required to insert double-headers early on. This was accepted and unanimously agreed that if necessary he could amalgamate the two divisions.

f) Referees Secretary (Russell Brooks)

- a. Russell said he had received match official allocations for September from Central Appointments.
- b. The Secretary asked how match officials are being informed of fixtures and Russell replied he sends them by email. The response was that not all have emails and Russell replied that those who do not he telephones. The Secretary said he felt that a sheet should be sent out monthly giving full details of fixtures.

g) Assistant Secretary (Sarah Harding)

- a. Absent (report submitted)
- b. Fines: 75 (See: Appendix – Fines (September Meeting (pages 7 and 8))
- c. The Secretary said that of these fines 27 were a result of failing to register players by the stipulated date and was exactly the same number as last season.
- d. The Secretary said that the Chairman had some concerns about fining those Clubs who had given their apologies for not attending the AGM the same as those who did not. It was agreed by the Committee that Clubs are not run by one person and others should have attended – the fines will stand as circulated.

h) Press/Results Secretary (Brian Shacklock)

- a. When Clubs telephone the result can they adhere to the instructions as shown in League Handbook and speak clearly. Only the HOME team need telephone the result except under Rule 11 (B).

i) League Welfare Officer (Emma Howard)

- a. Emma was a little concerned about Clubs that are just putting down a name as Club Welfare Officer and they do not hold a current CRB check. The Chairman stated this was a SCFA matter and she should bring it to their attention.

13/ CLUB REPRESENTATIVES

14/ ANY OTHER BUSINESS

a. League Development & Educational Programme

The Secretary in view what was about to be raised later no action to be taken as yet.

b. Officers Job Description

The Secretary said that this would help as and when position become vacant and any new applicants can see what is expected of them – if no officer wishes to put their views forward it will be done on their behalf. The Secretary did empathise that this was for future positions and not for current positions.

c. Rule Amendments – Season 2009/2010

The Secretary said these would be welcomed during the season from not only Clubs but Committee members.

d. Club Administration Award

The Chairman had drawn up details which were circulated to the meeting – it was agreed that this would include both the Ladies and Girls sections. The Chairman said that the award would be decided by the League Officers and sanctioned by the League Management Committee; he himself would keep the details updated. It was agreed by the meeting that a suitable trophy be awarded to the winning Club and that there would also be a monetary prizes of £150.00, £100.00 and £50.00 to the leading three Clubs.

e. RESPECT

- a. As a result of meeting at SCFA Headquarters the League has signed up for the RESPECT programme on behalf of the Clubs.
 - b. The Chairman said that Clubs (not Adults) would require having Respect Designated Spectator Area Barriers (DSA) but these would be of a cost to Clubs. It was agreed that instead of subsidising, at this time, Referees courses the League would purchase DSA's on the Clubs behalf at £42.89 each.
- f. Committee Expenses
It was agreed that there would be no change from previous season

PAUL PRESTON REPORT (SCFA Football Forum)

This was an interesting meeting - only clubs from our League were Eastbourne Girls, Adur Athletic Girls, Patcham United Girls and Worthing Minors Girls. James MacDonald was there representing a Crowborough League club as was someone from Uckfield Grasshoppers. Tammy Waine was there for Adur District Council, there were representatives from Horsham District Council and Inspire Leisure.

There was a meeting of Arun based clubs earlier but for boys matters I believe.

Confirmation was given that the Development squad are free to play for their clubs as well as within the Centre of Excellence scheme as the FA do not fund this so therefore the Centre of Excellence rule does not cover this. It be interesting to see how many Centre of Excellence players are in each squad.

Michelle had ideas of how the League should operate (ability based divisions or play each other once then split into ability based divisions) which I tried to dissuade that it is unworkable. Ideas about having two year age groups was banded about but I didn't agree with these as it gives too much of an age gap during a match as was having central locations for matches where facilities aren't available. Introduction of U10 was mentioned as SCFA run a tournament every 2 months in Burgess Hill for U10 and is well supported. There was even mention of inflatable goals!! I said that to change our method of deciding championship would need rule changes for AGMs etc. I brought up the subject of SCFA Cups for girls competitions. There was also a suggestion of keeping free weeks in the League season for matches but can't remember why - I said as long as I knew about the matches then I can move matches, didn't tell them about the Fixtures Policy for 2008-2009 (didn't want to cause a scene!!).

Kevin Tharme outlined the SCFA targets for girls and women's football and it has seemed to plateau in terms of clubs and players registered and SCFA have targets to increase this within four years. Michelle said that she wasn't that bothered by them hence the movements towards changing leagues away from reaching the SCFA target. I asked if the SCFA once they are aware of a club going under do anything with the club to say that there are clubs nearby for those players still wishing to play that they can go to as I said that if there are seven or eight girls that its easier for them within a social group to move all in one to another club - she said they did but I don't believe it.

Fundamentally, if the SCFA have targets then they have to be seen to do more to attract girls not for coaching sessions but to play for clubs (and new clubs at that) - to say they've coached 3000 girls could mean anything. They could have coached the same 100 girls thirty times - didn't say that they were different girls or gave any details as to where these sessions took place. This is not a League issue and I think the only thing we can do is mention that if a club struggles for numbers to contact Dan Lawson or Michelle Lawrence at SCFA to show that we are willing to do our bit and leave it for SCFA to worry about meeting their targets but to do so without disrupting what we have which is a very successful League for those clubs willing to organise and attract players.

Hopefully it will be the first of many meetings - although I am sure if Mr Knight had been in attendance it would have made a more thoroughly interesting meeting!!.

CHRIS COOPER REPORT (SCFA Football Forum)

The short answer is a good start.

Only 6 clubs were represented plus Paul and I along with some local authority sports representatives.

Ben Bartlett took all the comments about Centre of Excellence on the chin and I started the questions asking about the timetable and why it was all so late. There wasn't a real answer to this apart from the time it take to go through the committees at the FA and the fact they wanted to make the change now and not allow any potential overplay continue.

There were several questions from clubs about the effect of the rules but apart from being a forum to raise the questions and make comment there was no real resolution.

The important item from my point of view is the work Dan Lawson has been doing around the schools and a pretty graph that showed he's involved over 3000 girls in his sessions. Seeing as the root cause of teams withdrawing is lack of numbers I spent some time extolling the need for the SCFA (him and Michelle) to link in with clubs to build the interest and then hand the girls onto a club rather than just leaving the initiative for the girls to contact a club which we know doesn't happen once you lose the momentum.

Michelle was very keen on 9v9 and both Paul & I echoed the results of the clubs when it was last offered. Those that were present were keen on it, but purely as they couldn't get numbers to play 11v11. Also Michelle mentioned the playing alternate weeks for age groups in the 2 year spread so U13's play this week and 14's play next week but you could have the same girls playing in both. Again the root cause of this is numbers.

I was quite bullish to get some work done to solve the cause of the problem, i.e. player numbers, rather than tweak the Leagues etc. to suit the symptoms. Kevin Tharme seemed to agree with this and he has also asked the question where these 3000 girls have gone - especially as 90% of them were not linked to any club.

Those clubs on my table were unaware of the work Dan could do for them for free and would be taking this forwards - from a League point of view we provide a competition as approved by the clubs but at the end of the day they need to work with county to feed the players in at the levels they need. At the moment there is a lot of good work being done but it all needs joining together so when Dan goes into a school

there is a hand over to a club straight away and they can build it from there. Changing to 9v9 for the sake of numbers isn't the answer - there are other arguments for this to make the transition to 11 easier but if we solve the initial problem first then it would be appropriate for looking at how the transition to 11v11 works from a player development perspective. If teams opt for 9v9 based purely on numbers they will never be able to move to 11v11.

I think that covers it - Paul & I both reminded everyone that the League Committee only administer the League based on the rules agreed by clubs at the AGM, if they want change they need to propose them and, subject to county approval, things can develop from there.

Michelle closed by asking how often these meetings should be held and both Paul & I suggested quarterly to begin with then see how it goes but everyone there agreed the meeting was a good start.

ALAN KNIGHT REPORT (RESPECT PROGRAMME)

RESPECT PROGRAMME

- Response to largest ever football consultation 'Your Game, Your Say' involving 37,000 stakeholders
- Abuse towards referees and sideline behaviour are the top two issues football wants the FA to address.
- 98% of referees have received verbal abuse and 27% have received physical abuse
- One in three grassroots matches are now played without a qualified match official
- 846 grassroots matches were abandoned last year due to unacceptable behaviour from players and/or spectators

PRO GAME

Referee to talk to Captains and Coach (not just anyone) at Pre match briefing

Shake Hands (Football League now as well)

Tech Area – No TV Monitors – better behaviour within area

Codes of Conduct within Premiership League – Managers etc
Club Chairman – Charter to be signed – more responsibility

Media Role – trying to get as much help as possible (Football Association, Premiership and Football Leagues all working on this)

GRASS ROOTS

Not a dash – long Term Programme

Window available to get Pro Game on board, hence tight timescales

TEAM PACKS

Leagues to decide if they wish to be involved as a Respect League and apply for Club/Team packs

No1 & No2 that was raised by the consultation – Behaviour by Spectators, players and lack of Referees

Can be introduced as and when during season

Codes of Conducts – (Referees, Players, Managers/Coaches and Parents)

REFEREES – clear instructions to be given at “Toss of the Coin” – Law 12

Workshop to all Referees – no cost!

Captains role has changed – not “only Captain to talk to Ref” now Captain to be give more responsibility – made to feel important with Armband on

DSA’s (Designated Spectators’ Area)

Leagues to decide if they wish to be involved with the DSA’s (Designated Spectators Area).

Football Foundation: £1M grant aid 50% funding –

£176.25 + Delivery Retail price –

Football Association: negotiated price is £76.38 + vat (+ p&p at about £7.50) – Football Foundation Funding will therefore be only on the £38.19 rate (+ P&P at about £7.50)

All Leagues written to by the Football Association - 6th October & 1st November ordering times

1st November & 1st December – Vouchers issued

1 DSA per team or if League decrees – 1 per match and both sets of parents stand behind the one barrier.

Each DSA comes in the format as follows:

One bag with: One length of tape joined in two 60m lengths, 10 poles and 4 pegs and a mallet (different type available if using Artificial Type Pitch surface) ~ 12 month guarantees ~ easy to erect and dismantle!.
